Week of February 3, 2025

Just like that we are already into February and it's finally starting to feel like winter.

January has proven to be quite eventful thus far. Things are starting to move on the legislative side. MeWEA has been collaborating with the Maine DEP to support <u>LD25</u>. The allocated funds from this bond will be utilized for grants aimed at assisting municipalities, quasi-municipal entities and unorganized townships with wastewater treatment facility planning and construction of infrastructure projects facilitating proper management and disposal of wastewater sludge or biosolids.

Some legislative items we are keeping an eye on are:

LD231 An Act to Update the Solid Waste Management Hierarchy.

<u>LD235</u> Resolve, Regarding the Operation and Future Capacity of State-Owned Landfills

LD297 An Act Regarding the Management of Oversized Bulky Waste

We will continue to keep members updated as we continue to move forward through this legislative session.

As you know EPA has released the draft effluent criteria as well as the draft risk assessment for biosolids. MeWEA will be working with NACWA and WEF to issue comments. We will keep you updated as we proceed.
